Fans left in uproar after the new Manchester arena Co-op Live announces it is not ready to open its doors less than an hour before American Rapper A Boogie Wit Da Hoodie was set to play. This was shortly followed by the announcement of the postponement of the Olivia Rodrigo concerts which were supposed to take place May 3rd and 4th. This is now one of many events that have been postponed due to technical difficulties at the venue with many concerts changing arenas leaving some skeptical about the arena and worried if upcoming concerts will have the same fate as the previous ones. With the likes of Elbow, Eric Clapton, Peter Kay and Nicki Minaj set to perform throughout May, the pressure is on for the Co-op to get everything up and running again before even more heartache is caused for fans.

It has not yet been announced that the concerts are cancelled so fans can still expect them to go ahead as normal for now however that can change at any moment, so it is recommended to keep an eye on the Co-op Live website and social media to stay up to date with any changes or accommodations that have been put in place by the venue.
